Maximum	Five visits per benefit period

Preventive mammogram	
Deductible, benefit percentage	Waived, 100%
Maximum	One per benefit period
Preventive Pap smear	
Deductible, benefit percentage	Waived, 100%
Maximum	One per benefit period
Colon Cancer Screening (age 50 and over)	
Fecal occult blood test	
Deductible, benefit percentage	Waived, 100%
Maximum	One per benefit period
Sigmoidoscopy	
Deductible, benefit percentage	Waived, 100%
Maximum	One every five years
Colonoscopy	
Deductible, benefit percentage	Waived, 100%
Maximum	One every 10 years
Virtual colonoscopy	
Deductible, benefit percentage	Waived, 100%
Maximum	One every five years

Services submitted to MUST with an active-illness diagnostic code will be paid under the Medical Benefit (rather than the Preventive Benefit) and deductibles and co-insurance will apply.
